Frequently our work serves as a basis for capacity building and is always focused on finding innovative solutions that make a difference on the ground. Qualifications

- Professional architecture degree.
- Interest in community-based design and construction processes.
- Knowledge of community planning principles and processes.
- Hands-on construction experience.
- Knowledge of building documents, materials, planning, and organization of construction projects.
- Proficiency in use of Adobe Creative Suite, AutoCAD and other design-related software packages.
- Excellent graphic design and visual representation skills (e.g., sketching, rendering, creating documents, etc.).
- Effective and efficient research skills.
- Excellent written, oral and visual communication and presentation skills.
- Ability to travel frequently, extensively and at short notice required.

Attributes

- Ability to work collaboratively and independently, take initiative and be resourceful; capable of providing leadership when required.
- Good interpersonal skills.
- Strong organization and time management skills.

Duties

- Work as a team to engage community members in design/build projects as part of implementing long-term community plans.
- Produce tools to facilitate community-based design/build processes (e.g., panels, models, illustrations, etc.).
- Organize and facilitate community charrettes, workshops, etc.
- Develop construction drawings specifically tailored to a community design/build process.
- Organize construction crews with a focus on involving community members and building local capacity.
- Assist community contacts with the sourcing of local materials and other resources.
- Capture outcomes of design/build projects in various types of publications.

Salary & contract: Starting salary of \$36,500 annually; contract length of 4 months beginning in May 2011. There is potential for extension based on funding and performance.
